Receiving Holy Communion - We welcome to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy those Christians who are from other Christian Denominations and who are not fully united with us. Sadly, it is a consequence of the divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to you an invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is the work or action of the celebrating Community signifying a oneness of faith, life, and worship of the believing Community. Reception of Holy Communion by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must pray. **However, all present** are welcome to partake of the Antidoro (blessed bread) which is distributed at the end of the Liturgy.

Epistle Reading

Prokeimenon. Fourth Mode. Daniel 3.26,27.

Blessed are you, O Lord, the God of our fathers.

Verse: For you are just in all you have done.

The reading is from St. Paul's Letter to Titus 3:8-15.

Titus, my son, the saying is sure. I desire you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to apply themselves to good deeds; these are excellent and profitable to men. But avoid stupid controversies, genealogies, dissensions, and quarrels over the law, for they are unprofitable and futile. As for a man who is factious, after admonishing him once or twice, have nothing more to do with him, knowing that such a person is perverted and sinful; he is self-condemned. When I send Artemas or Tychicos to you, do your best to come to me at Nicopolis, for I have decided to spend the winter there. Do your best to speed Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their way; see that they lack nothing. And let our people learn to apply themselves to good deeds, so as to help cases of urgent need, and not to be unfruitful. All who are with me send greeting to you. Greet those who love us in the faith. Grace be with you all. Amen.

GOSPEL

The Reading is from Luke 8:5-15

The Lord said this parable: "A sower went out to sow his seed; and as he sowed, some fell along the path, and was trodden under foot, and the birds of the air devoured it. And some fell on the rock; and as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns grew with it and choked it. And some fell into good soil and grew, and yielded a hundredfold." And when his disciples asked him what this parable meant, he said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God; but for others they are in parables, so that seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand. Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. The ones along the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, that they may not believe and be saved. And the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy; but these have no root, they believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. And as for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bring forth fruit with patience." As he said these things, he cried out "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Sunday of the 7th Ecumenical Council

On the Sunday that falls on or immediately after the eleventh of this month, we chant the Service to the 350 holy Fathers of the Seventh Ecumenical Council, which gathered in Nicaea in 787 under the holy Patriarch Tarasius and during the reign of the Empress Irene and her son, Constantine Porphyrogenitus, to refute the Iconoclast heresy, which had received imperial support beginning with the Edict issued in 726 by Emperor Leo the Isaurian. Many of the holy Fathers who condemned Iconoclasm at this holy Council later died as Confessors and Martyrs for the holy Icons during the second assault of Iconoclasm in the ninth century, especially during the reigns of Leo the Armenian and Theophilus.

SERMON

THE SELF-CONDEMNATION OF THE HERETICAL PERSON

On today's Sunday, the Church honors the Godbearing Fathers, who convened the Seventh Ecumenical Council in Nicaea of Bithynia in the year 787. The Fathers of the aforesaid Council submitted their experience in Christ with reference to the subject of the veneration of the holy icons. With their theological speech, holiness, and their high spiritual level, they proclaimed that, since the Son and Word of God incarnated, we have the ability to depict His figure, according to the ancient church tradition.

The depiction of the Lord expresses the faith of the Church that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (Jn. 1:14). Also, we depict the figure of the Holy Theotokos, who through the action of the Holy Spirit gave birth to the Son of God, the incarnate and, of course, we depict all the Saints, who were shown to be true members of the Body of Christ and who intercede to God for the salvation of all people. Thus, the Church teaches that the honor, the relative worship of the icon goes, passes, refers to the original, i.e. to the depicted person. Therefore, the truth of the icons is found in the persons that are depicted; and every believer who piously venerates them lives this truth, with grace of God. We consider this to be the position of the Church against the iconoclasts of every era.

The Epistle reading of this Sunday comes from the Apostle Paul's letter to Titus and is directly connected with the issue of heretics - iconoclasts. Titus with Timothy belonged to Paul's closest colleagues. In Paul's second imprisonment in Rome, Titus is probably near him. Furthermore, before this imprisonment, Paul had entrusted him with the governing of the Church of Crete, with the exhortation to install presbyters there. In Crete, he reposed peacefully, after he had suffered hardships with Paul and other Apostles for the sake of the Gospel of Christ.

The Apostle Paul, at the beginning of our passage, underlines the truth of the words he mentioned in the immediately preceding paragraph. In other words, he urges Titus to remind the members of the Church that they have received the baptism of rebirth and the renewal that the Holy Spirit gives. Therefore, they must proceed accordingly, to lead a life full of love for God and fellow man. Love for God is expressed, first of all, by the acceptance of the right faith of the Church. Every heretical deviation from this belief results in man's separation from God. And according to this, the heretic becomes self-condemned, since he himself chooses darkness rather than the light, falsehood rather than the truth, death rather than life.

The Church does not stop praying and loving in Christ, the person who found himself in the horrible darkness of heretical beliefs. With unique vividness, Saint Chrysostom points out that if we must turn away and hate anything, it is heresy and sin, and not the heretic or the sinner.

Because man is the work of God, while error is the work of the devil. "Do not therefore mix the things of God and the things of the devil." May all those who have separated from the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church receive God's illumination and return. To become partakers of the Bread of life and the Drink of immortality, which is imperishable love (St. Ignatius the Godbearer).

Join us on Saturday, November 4, from 2:00 to 5:00 PM, when Philoptochos will host an afternoon with Stella Nahatis, author of the book "Taxi to America".



Stella's journey from Thessaloniki, Greece to America begins with a pre-dawn taxi ride that she and her sister share while the coffin holding a loved one rides along in the taxi's trunk. Orphaned and separated from her younger sister "for her own good" as the culture dictated at the time, Stella ends up being adopted by a Greek couple that had emigrated to Boston, Massachusetts in the US. At age 11, she overcomes multiple losses and cultural differences to find a place in her new homeland, while finding ways to stay connected to those she loved in Greece.

This story of resilience and perseverance follows Stella's journey of becoming an "Amerikanaki" and eventually reconnecting with her sister, who had stayed in Greece with her own set of adoptive parents. Even as Stella embraces her new life and culture in America, she rebuilds her loving relationship with her sister after an eight-year separation. Later in life, the sisters take another taxi ride together, this time to recover important details of their birth parents' life stories that mirror the determination to survive and thrive that marks their own.

The book will be available for purchase—\$25/soft cover and \$35/hard cover.



Stella Nahatis is a talented writer who has recently captivated readers with her poignant memoir, *Taxi to America*. With a compelling storytelling style and an honest exploration of personal experiences, Nahatis takes readers on an emotional journey from Greece to America. Her debut book offers a raw and authentic portrayal of triumphs, challenges and self-discovery. Nahatis's background includes a career with Trans World Airlines and a strong commitment to helping others. Her volunteerism includes working with Beverly School for the Deaf, Pathways for Children, The Greek Orthodox Church in Ipswich, The Massachusetts Golf Association, and since 1987 CareDimensions Hospice and Palliative Care. She is most happy when surrounded by family and friends, whether at home, in her community or on the golf course. Stella and her husband live in Manchester-by-the-Sea, MA.

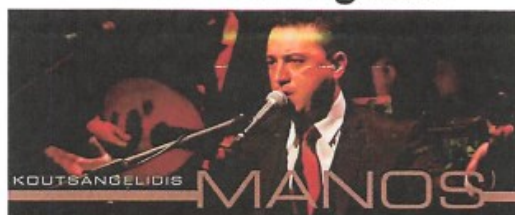
